Lutheran School has 6 PD days scheduled for the 22-23 year, as well as providing substitute teachers for teachers to take time off during the week. Title IIA funds will supplement the PD needs throughout the year.

Describe how these services and/or program will be evaluated for effectiveness:
Student engagement and achievement and related teacher goals will be measured through formal observations, surveys, and assessments.

Conference Registration Request (form)

1. Fill out the school info form with conference expenses. Registration for LEC 2022 is \$173. Hotel cost is \$112/night. Approximate total cost is \$400 depending on your location.
2. Fill out the “Justification based on program goals” or other similar section.

The goals of the Lutheran Education Conference are to provide excellent professional development to teachers in Lutheran Schools based on nationally-known education experts. Three areas of education excellence will be provided in the LEC program: Early Childhood Education literacy; high engagement student technology usage; and literacy pedagogy to affect student achievement in middle and high school students. Speakers on these topics include Donalyn Miller on early childhood literacy teaching, Matt Miller on “Ditch that Textbook’ and high engagement technology usage, and Matt de la Pena on growing reluctant older student readers.

These forms should be submitted within 6 weeks of LEC to allow the public school district enough time to register and pay for LEC.
